
Hotel Century Southern Tower

We recommend staying at a hotel close to the station in order to enjoy Shinjuku to the full. Hotel Century Southern Tower is a 3-minute walk from the South Exit of Shinjuku Station. This hotel is conveniently located near the Shinjuku Station platform for "N'EX" arrivals, which connect Tokyo to Narita Airport.

Check out trendy fashions and unique goods

After eating, go to Shinjuku Station South Exit. You can enjoy shopping in the many fashion and miscellaneous goods stores between the 2nd and 6th floors of the Shinjuku Mylord building, which is connected to Shinjuku Station. You will likely be able to find a perfect outfit in one of the diverse range of shops here. Don't forget to check out the popular Japanese fashions, too.

Mosaic Street - another stylish sightseeing attraction!

Mosaic Street is a stylish road that conveniently links Shinjuku Station South Exit and West Exit. Shops and restaurants line both sides of the road, and there are beautiful illuminations in wintertime.







Odakyu Department Store



Easy access using the walkway connected to Shinjuku Mylord near Shinjuku Station South Exit. Odakyu Department Store is a large department store near Shinjuku Station West Exit. Here you can find a wealth of leading products from international brands, such as Channel and Louis Vuitton, as well as cosmetics by famous brands. On the 1st floor of the building there is a counter designed for foreigners, so be sure to pay a visit if you have any questions about shopping.



A walkway connects the Odakyu Department Store with the 2nd floor of Shinjuku Mylord. This is handy for moving around without getting wet in the rain.

Tired from walking? Have a rest in a stylish cafe!

There are numerous cafes and restaurants in Odakyu Department Store, so you can stop for a rest whenever you are tired from shopping. We recommend the rooftop Cafe Plants on the 9th floor of the main building, where you can unwind with a calm coffee break in a relaxing space.



With 14 floors above ground and two underground floors, this is one of Shinjuku's main department stores. The ladies' fashion area was relaunched in 2009 and now boasts an extensive line-up of stores.



Cafe Plants uses its rooftop space as a popular terrace location. Cake sets start at 700 yen.

After relaxing at a cafe, take the passageway that connects the 2nd floor of the Odakyu Department Store with Odakyu Halc to go to the famous Japanese consumer electronics store Bic Camera. The five levels between the 2nd and 6th floors deal in the latest electronics, including consumer electronics, computers, cameras and PDAs. Beauty products and medicines are also stocked, so you can always rely on coming here for any sudden needs that may arise during your stay.

From the skyscraper area to the Tokyo Metropolitan Government Observation Decks

A 10-minute walk from Shinjuku Station West Exit you will find the Tokyo Metropolitan Government, which is a tall building even among the skyscrapers of Shinjuku. The 45-storey government building has an observation deck at 202m that offers outstanding views. Admission is free.

Tokyo Tower and Skytree can be seen within the Tokyo area, and even Mt. Fuji can be seen in the distance depending on the weather. If you go up to the observation deck for the sunset, you will be able to see yet another type of scenery.

Returning to Shinjuku Station West Exit from Tokyo Metropolitan Government, Haruchika is below ground in Odakyu Halc, which also hosts Bic Camera. This is a somewhat unusual restaurant area. The eight different restaurants on one floor are like lively stalls. There are so many tempting restaurants that it can be confusing, so it might be fun to try a little at a number of stores. You could try Japan's unique "Okonomiyaki" dishes.

Japan's classic drinking snacks. "Yakitori" is roast chicken on skewers, while "Yakiton" uses pork.

Shinjuku Kabuki Cho's special nightlife

One of Japan's largest nightlife districts, with many bars and restaurants open until late at night or even until morning, Kabuki Cho is often called the sleepless town. Energetic people should definitely check it out!



Recommended locations not on the model course

There are so many interesting spots in Shinjuku that we cannot possibly list them all here. Instead, we will introduce some of the highlights.



Flags

This fashion building is on the east side of Shinjuku Station's South Exit. This is a stylish shopping area that includes the famous Tower Records for music CDs and stores such as Gap for fashion.



Cuisine[s] Michel Troisgros

Cuisine[s] Michel Troisgros is a French restaurant at the luxurious Hyatt Regency Tokyo hotel. Internationally famous chef M. Troisgros here shows off his talent for authentic French cuisine.



Shinjuku Imperial Gardens

The former Imperial family's gardens are located about 10 minutes east of Shinjuku Station's South Exit. The gardens are open to the public, and at 53.8ha are something of an oasis in the middle of the city.

Hanazono Shrine

Hanazono Shrine is an area at odds with the large cityscape of Shinjuku. It has a long history stretching back to the 1600s. The peaceful atmosphere of the grounds will give you a taste of olden times.
