Recommended sightseeing spots in the Tanzawa-Oyama region

Oyama Afuri-jinja Shrine

Founded in pre-Christian times. Jomon pottery thought to have been used in religious rituals has been excavated from the mountain top. Mt.Oyama is also known as "Amefuriyama" or mountain of abundant rain, and was a center for rainmaking rite beliefs since ancient times. It was also a worship site for Minamoto no Yoritomo (first shogun of the Kamakura shogunate in 1192) and successive generations of the Tokugawa shogunate (1603-1867). The Honsha, or main shrine, is at the peak and the Shimosha is on the slope of the mountain.



Mt. Fuji and Mt. Oyama

Oyamatsumi no Okami the deity to which the Oyama Afuri-jinja Shrine is dedicated teamed with "dual pilgrims" for Mt. Oyama and Mt. Fuji, as the deity is the father of Konohana no Sakuyahime, the goddess of Mt. Fuji.



Hinata-yakushi Temple

Founded in 716. One of the three Japanese Hinata-yakushi healing Buddha. The principal hatchet-carved (nata-bori) image of the healing Buddha is a statue usually not on public view, but is open for viewing on January 1-3, January 8, and April 15. At the treasury, you can inspect votive images of Yakushi-nyorai, Amida-nyorai and Juuni-shinsho, the 12 guardian gods of Yakushi. It is a famous spot for plum and cherry blossoms in spring, and red spider lily in autumn.



Iiyama-kannon Temple

Said to have its beginnings following construction by Minamoto no Yoritomo. The principle object of an 11-Headed Kannon is a small Buddha of 10cm, and the 176cm 11-Headed Kannon is enshrined in the interior. It is known as a famous spot for cherry blossoms in spring and the best time to see it is when the blossoms form a tunnel over the path.

Oyama-dera Temple

Founded in 755 AD. The principal votive icon of Fudo-Myoo, the God of Fire, constructed in the Kamakura era, is unveiled on the 8th, 18th and 28th of each month. Affectionately called "Oyama-no-ofudo-san," it has been familiar since ancient times as one of the three great Fudos of the Kanto region. Kobo Daishi (774-835) served here in the Heian era (794-1192) and many historical relics associated with him can also be seen.



Famous autumnal foliage spot

Oyama-dera Temple is famous as a sightseeing spot for autumn foliage. The area around Oyama-sando street, the approach to the front of the main sanctuary, has particularly resplendent views of foliage.
