Showing your Hakone Kamakura pass entitles you to discounts or other benefits at designated facilities in the Hakone and Kamakura areas.

*For details on designated railway areas and facilities that provide preferential treatment, please refer to the Odakyu Electric Railway global website.

[Notes regarding usage]

- Please get your pass stamped when using the pass for the first time at the ticket gate of each operator.
- Please show your Hakone Kamakura pass in a way that allows the staff to see the period of validity when you go through each ticket gate.
- If you ride beyond designated areas, you will have to pay an extra fare.
- This pass does not cover travel on Limited Express Romancecars. To ride one of these, you must pay a surcharge for a limited express ticket (reserved seat ticket).
- When you have finished traveling and no longer need the pass, please return it to a staff member.
- Regardless of what time you start using the pass, the period of validity will end when transport operating hours end on the third day.

[Notes regarding refunds]

- We cannot refund fares after you have started using the pass.
- We will refund the amount paid for the pass after deducting the refund handling fee, but only if you have not used the pass at all and request a refund within the period of validity.
- Transportation services maybe cancelled in the event of bad weather. If service has been cancelled, you may apply for a refund at the Odakyu Sightseeing Service Center.



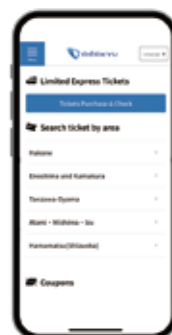
For greater comfort and speed! Reserve a seat on the Limited Express Romancecar!

A small extra charge in addition to your Hakone Kamakura pass, allows you the use of the Odakyu Limited Express Romancecar. (One way charge from Shinjuku to Hakone-Yumoto is 1,200yen per adult, and from Shinjuku to Katase-Enoshima is 750yen per adult.)

*You can save 50 yen if you use the Odakyu's digital ticket purchase website (EMot Online Tickets) to purchase your electronic limited express ticket.

Buying limited express tickets using a smartphone is easy and convenient with EMot Online Tickets!

- Please use a smartphone to purchase limited express tickets (They cannot be purchased using a PC or tablet PC)
- Pay by credit card
- Limited express tickets can be purchased for up to 8 people at one time

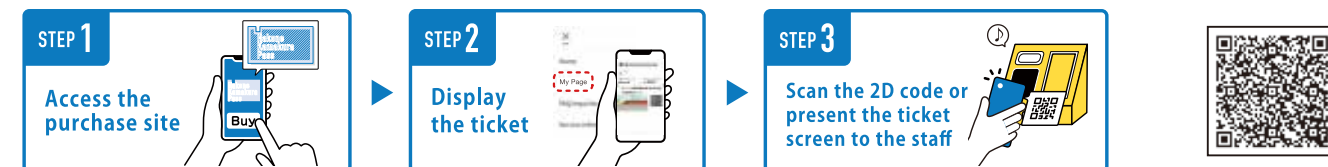

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- The Hakone Kamakura pass can be purchased starting one month prior to the date of travel.
- The Hakone Kamakura pass does not include limited express surcharges.
- The Hakone Kamakura pass and limited express tickets can be purchased at EMot Online Tickets, or Odakyu Sightseeing Service Center, Shinjuku West / Shinjuku South.

Hakone area



1 Hakone Yuryo
This traditional hot-spring resort offers one of the largest private open-air baths in the greater Tokyo area as well as meals cooked on a traditional hearth and various relaxing facilities.



2 The Hakone Open-Air Museum
This museum exhibits outstanding modern and contemporary sculptures in an outdoor setting. Visitors can enjoy the harmonious balance of art and nature.



3 Owakudani
Ride the Hakone Ropeway for a stunning view of Mt. Fuji and the smoldering valley below. Also, enjoy eating black eggs, which are said to extend your life by 7 years for each one you eat.



4 Lake Ashi
Lake Ashi, symbol of Hakone. On clear days, World Heritage Site Mt. Fuji is visible from Hakonemachi-ko and Motohakone-ko ports.



5 Hakone-jinja Shrine
Reputedly founded in 757, this shrine is where the Tokugawa and other samurai families worshipped. Its "red gate of peace" is visible on the shore of Lake Ashi.



6 Gotemba Premium Outlets®
One of Japan's largest outlet malls, it features roughly 290 leading domestic and world luxury brands shops.

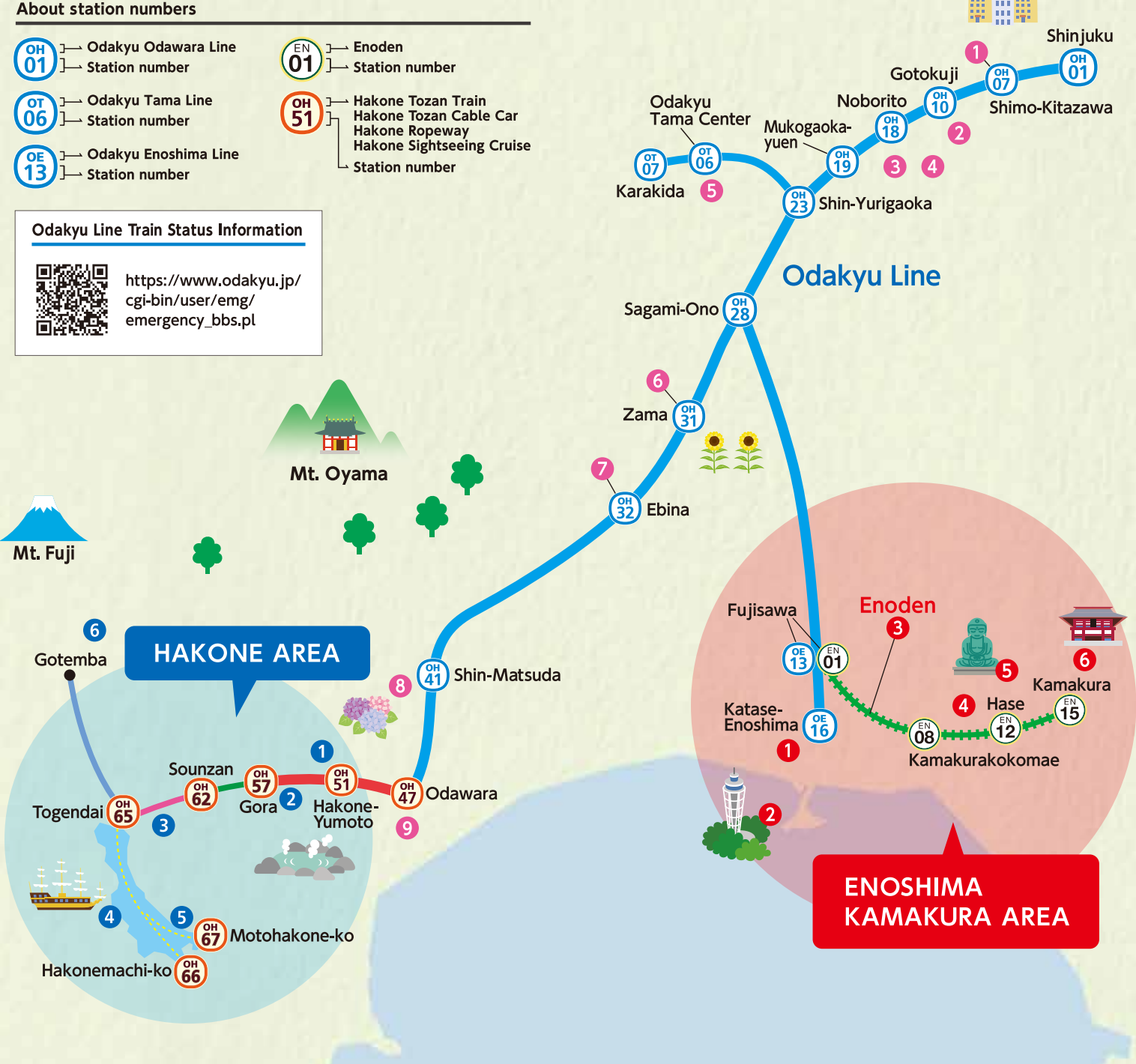

The map illustrates the Odakyu Line route, starting from Shinjuku (OH 01) and passing through Gotokuji (OH 07), Shimo-Kitazawa (OH 01), Noborito (OH 18), Mukogaoka-yuen (OH 19), Shin-Yurigaoka (OH 23), Sagami-Ono (OH 28), Zama (OH 31), Ebina (OH 32), Shin-Matsuda (OH 41), and Odawara (OH 47). It also shows branches to the Enoshima Line (OE 13, OE 16) and Enoden (EN 01, EN 08). The Hakone Area includes stations like Gotemba (OH 65), Togendai (OH 65), Sounzan (OH 62), Gora (OH 57), Hakone-Yumoto (OH 51), and Motohakone-ko (OH 67). The Enoshima and Kamakura Area includes stations like Fujisawa (OE 13), Katase-Enoshima (OE 16), Kamakurakomae (EN 12), Hase (EN 12), and Kamakura (EN 15). Landmarks like Mt. Fuji, Mt. Oyama, and Lake Ashi are also marked.

Enoshima Kamakura area



1 Enoshima Aquarium
This wide-open aquarium facing Shonan Coast offers a variety of attractions, including dolphin shows, sardines shoaling in the Big Sagami Bay Tank, and fantastic jellyfish shows.



2 Enoshima Sea Candle
The symbol of Enoshima Island, this 60 meter tall lighthouse and observation tower offers a beautiful 360-degree panoramic view that takes in Mt. Fuji on sunny days.



3 Enoden
Passengers can enjoy spectacular views of Mt. Fuji, and of the sea, from the train windows; the sunset at Enoshima is also really beautiful. So taking the train is an enjoyable experience in itself!



4 Hasedera Temple
Many tourists visit this temple for the scenic view from its observation deck, and enjoy the surrounding hydrangeas and sweet flags in early summer.



5 Kotoku-in
This temple is famous for its colossal Great Buddha of Kamakura, which is 11.312 meters tall and can be entered by visitors.



6 Tsurugaoka Hachimangu
Deeply associated with Minamoto no Yoritomo, the first shogun of the Kamakura shogunate. Visitors come to pray for good health, achievement, matchmaking and protection from misfortune.

Recommended tourist spots along Odakyu Line



1 Shimo-Kitazawa
This district is popular among the younger generation for its unique fashion stores and dining options. There are also many theaters and live music clubs. (Odakyu Line Shimo-Kitazawa Sta.)



2 Gotokuji Temple
This temple is renowned for its myriad maneki-neko figurines, which are enshrined as lucky charms. (Approx. 15 min. walk from Gotokuji Sta.)



3 Japan Open-air Folk House Museum
This museum features traditional farmhouses from the Edo period, which have been designated as Important Cultural Assets. You can also try soba noodles and dango dumplings here. (Approx. 13 min. walk from Mukogaoka-yuen Sta.)



4 Fujiko • F • Fujio Museum
This museum showcases the works of cartoonist Fujiko • F • Fujio, along with a recreation of his studio and of a famous empty lot that often appears in his work. (Approx. 10 min. by bus from Noborito Sta.)
*Advance reservation is required. Tickets are not sold at the museum.



5 Sanrio Puroland
Meet Hello Kitty and other popular Sanrio Characters at this all-indoor theme park. Spectacular musical performances and parades entertain children as well as adults. (Approx. 6 min. walk from Odakyu Tama Center Sta.)
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6 Sunflower fields in Zama
Every year from late July to mid-August, approximately 550,000 blooming sunflowers provide an impressive scene for visitors. (There is a shuttle bus service from Sobudai-mae Sta.)



7 Romancecar Museum
This railway museum has plenty to offer for both children and adults, with six types of Romancecar, a large-scale diorama portraying the Odakyu Line, and a train driving simulator. (Near Ebina Sta.)
*Advance reservation is required until further notice. (As of Sept. 2021)



8 Matsudayama Herb Garden
Enjoy colorful herbs on a hillside. From mid-February to mid-March, you can also see the splendid contrast of Kawazu-cherry blossoms and yellow canola flowers. (Approx. 25min walk from Shin-Matsuda Sta.)



9 Odawara Castle Park
One of Japan's top 100 historical parks where flowers bloom and numerous events are held throughout the year. (Approx. 10 min. walk from Odawara Sta.)
